Mary Treadwell - Watercolor

Our April 6th meeting will feature a painting demonstration by Mary Treadwell. In her early years, Treadwell studied with artists in the Boston area as well as Marblehead, MA. Throughout the last twelve years, her experiences have taken on an international flair. With continued study and work, she has gained wide acceptance as both an artist and teacher while living in both London and Paris. Treadwell moved to the Dallas area in the autumn of 2003 where she is painting, teaching, and continuing to remain close to the art world of Paris. Treadwell teaches watercolor painting at the House of Colors in Grapevine where her work is also exhibited. Her work can be viewed online at Aurora Images Gallery.

Treadwell works primarily in watercolor. Her works reflect a broad range of subject matter from colorful wildlife to flowers and from traditional landscapes to realistic cityscapes. For her demonstration, Treadwell will paint a large, vibrant flower to showcase her unique watercolor technique.

Amie Adelman, Fibers Coordinator and Assistant Professor at the School of Visual Arts, University of North Texas, is this year's calendar juror. She holds an MFA in Fibers from the University of Kansas. UNT grants have supported trips to research textiles in Guatemala, Ghana, South Africa, and Norway. Currently she has a solo exhibition in Risor, Norway, and is exhibiting artwork at the U.S. Embassy in Almaty, Kazakhstan.

Adelman's artwork has been published in two books and several journals including: *Dyeing and Screen-Printing on Textiles*, *Fiberarts Design Book Six*, *American Craft*, *Surface Design*, and *Fiberarts*.

Adelman's teaching experiences include basketry, works on paper, fabric printing and design, and weaving. Her own work, strongly influenced by weaving drafts, explores the grid-design structures routinely utilized in loom preparation. She weaves humor into the serious structure of the grid with unexpected stickers, truck reflectors, and game pieces. In 2005 she installed a major work in the DFW Hyatt Regency.

VAST has secured enough exhibition space for the Members Exhibition to permit each entering member one piece in the show. We have always honored the tradition of a true members exhibit that showcases the broad range of expression of our member artists. But last year the East Gallery in the Center for the Visual Arts could not hold all the wonderful art submitted. That was very unfortunate.

Two things happened this spring to change this situation: The Greater Denton Arts Council invited us to move our exhibition from the smaller East Gallery to the more spacious Meadows Gallery. In addition, Banter — a great coffee, tapas, and bistro restaurant located at 219 West Oak Street off the Denton Square — offered us their large exhibition space for the show. So we will have art in both galleries, and the exhibit opening will feature a progressive reception!

Janet Shaw, Director of the Visual Arts Coalition of Dallas, is this year's juror. Members Exhibition Prospectuses will be available beginning April 6 at the 7 pm General Meeting. They will be mailed out to all members in mid-April and distributed around town. All media are welcome (no installations). 40" is the maximum *width* size — please check the Prospectus for other entry requirements. We can enter two works, but only one will be selected. Take-in days are July 13-14. The exhibition opens July 30 and closes August 24.

We are delighted to welcome new member Lacie Smith, 214-564-1644 (lsmith@sangerisd.net), who has agreed to chair the exhibition.

Just as a reminder — artists may join and enter at the time they bring work. So y'all spread the word and begin working!

Texas Craft Initiative comes to Denton!

In March Ann Lancaster from the Texas Commission on the Arts (TCA) facilitated a half-day discussion in Denton. The topic addressed was the Texas Craft Initiative being coordinated by TCA. One of the components of the initiative is to create an online registry of Texas craft artists for the purposes of networking among artists and marketing the skills and products available by these artists. The registry provides a state-level venue for an artist to include a representative image of his/her work, a brief biography/artist statement, and a link to a personal website. TCA also encourages artists to establish e-commerce options for buyers to purchase items for sale, but this is not a requirement. TCA will help artists establish an e-commerce component on their websites.

Pastel Workshop with Judy McCombs July 10-12



The PBS show, *Wonderful World of Art, Painting with Judy*, aired in more than forty states. This is one of several painting shows that McCombs has filmed and televised. Now you have the chance to paint with her in person this summer.

Even after more than 25 years of teaching experience, McCombs sees herself as a lifelong student of art. Her continual motivation for perfecting her own art cre-

ates a fresh, energetic, and interactive learning environment for her students. McComb's workshop will include demonstrations of pastel painting techniques as well as lots of one-on-one instruction and critique.

McCombs is a landscape painter with a love of nature as strong as her love of art. She travels widely, gathering information for painting subjects through photographs and plein air sketches. She writes, "To spend the day outside, not just looking but really seeing nature . . . life just doesn't get any better." She hopes to include some plein air experience in the VAST workshop if weather permits.

McCombs holds workshops yearly in Europe and will also be in the San Juan Islands this June. Her gallery representation is as widespread as her travels: Albuquerque, Taos, and Sun Valley, as well as her home state of Oklahoma. 

