#### David Crismon, "The Creative Process for Artists"

Painter David Crismon, our guest artist at the September meeting, will speak about the creative process for artists/painters. Crismon states: "Artists usually like to talk shop, so this will be a useful way to generate that kind of dialog." This Oklahoma City artist paints oil on metal and is represented by the Craighead-Green Gallery in Dallas.

A recently-completed body of work was done in response to early American paintings that depicted the people, landscape and culture of America. "What we understand as our daily reality is embedded in not only countless images but also countless ways of seeing," states Crismon. He feels that our concept of anything is informed by technology. His paintings are derived from photography, video stills, motion pictures, and found images. He edits his images by colorizing, splicing, and manipulating the images.

Crismon received his BFA from Kansas City Art Institute and his MFA from the University of Oklahoma and has had numerous solo and group exhibitions. View his work at www.craighead-green.com or on the ntaal.org website.

#### Workshop Policy

The following workshop policy was adopted during the March Board Meeting to be effective September 2004.

- 1) REGISTRATION FEE: The registration fee is \$50.00, and is due at the time of signing up for the workshop. This fee is *non-refundable*.
- 2) BALANCE: The balance for the workshop is due *one month* prior to the beginning of the workshop.
- 3(a) CANCELLATION BY PARTICIPANT: If a participant must cancel, the VAST workshop coordinator will first attempt to fill the open spot from the official VAST waiting list. If there is no waiting list, the canceling participant is free to attempt to fill the spot on his/her own. No refunds will be made one month or less prior to the class.
- 3(b) CANCELLATION BY VAST: If there are not enough participants to cover workshop costs, or if VAST must cancel for any other reason, participants will be notified by workshop coordinator and will promptly receive a full refund, including deposit.
- 4) NON-MEMBERS: Non-members may participate in the workshop after paying VAST membership dues to the membership chair.
- 5) WORKSHOP COORDINATOR: The workshop coordinator may participate in the workshop at no charge and is available to assist the guest artist before, during and after the workshop.
- 6) RETURNED CHECKS: Checks that are returned to VAST by the bank for insufficient funds are subject to a \$25.00 handling fee by VAST to the participant.

#### **Proposed Change in VAST Constitution**

We will vote on the following addition at our September 2 general meeting. This clause must be included in our constitution for 501c3 status.

Upon the dissolution of VAST, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a Court of Competent Jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.
