She likes to do plein aire pen and watercolor sketches, preferring to work from these rather than from photographs. She says, "I like to soak up the ambiance of a locale and often paint from memory."

In addition to landscapes and still lifes, June enjoys painting abstractly, often working on themes such as musical instruments or architecture.

June Dalton grew up in Fort Worth, and her parents' friendship with an artist was an early inspiration. A high school teacher who was an associate of "The Modernist School" at the museum in Fort Worth served as a mentor and strongly influenced her desire to be an artist.
